			<b>Louisiana CPA Requirements:</b> (1) Have a baccalaureate degree; (2) Have 150 hours of college credit earned as prescribed by Board Rules; (3) Have successfully completed 24 hours of specific Accounting and 24 hours of Business courses (including an acceptable Business Law course). You will need 30 additional credit hours of coursework to be qualified for the exam, but the Accounting and Business requirements are met by this degree.											

**Graduation requirement:** Minimum 120 hours + GPA of 2.0: (1) Overall; (2) In Business courses taken at Loyola, including ACCT, BA, DECS, ECON, FIN, INTB, LGST, MGT, and MKT courses combined; (3) In all Major courses taken at Loyola.**Residence requirement:** See CoB Bulletin. **Note:** An advising file is maintained as a service to the student and faculty advisor. The **official** record used to certify the student for graduation is kept and may be reviewed in the Dean's Office.

**Requirements Across the Curriculum (RAC):**

A check-off course is required in each of the three areas listed below (i.e., one of each designated course area). Requirement can be fulfilled by courses offered in the Advanced Common Curriculum, or upper-level major or elective courses. For most College of Business students, these requirements will be fulfilled in common curriculum or non-business elective courses.

**Catholic Tradition (C):** The Catholic Tradition courses focus on and express the Catholic dimension of Loyola University's mission as a Catholic and Jesuit institution and fulfill the university's commitment to dialogue with the modern world in light of tradition and faith. This requirement will usually be fulfilled in a Religious Studies or History Adv. CC course.

**Diversity (D):** The Diversity courses focus on understanding the perspectives of minorities or marginalized communities in the US or around the world and increase student appreciation for and understanding of cultures and societies other than their own. This requirement will usually be fulfilled in a History, Religion, Social Science, or Arts & Cultures Adv. CC course.

**Diversity courses currently approved in the CC include:** ENGL V234; HIST U220, 260, 261, 262, 285, 286, 294, X294; MUGN U202, 204, 244, 274; RELS U277, 281, 283, 343; SOCI U241, 255, 305, X312; SPAN V261; THEA U243, V270; VISA U236.

**Premodern (P):** The Premodern courses focus on understanding the early foundations of the modern world including the origin of major religions, philosophical traditions, and ideologies of jurisprudence or politics. This requirement will usually be fulfilled in a Religion or Arts & Culture Adv. CC course. Currently it may not be fulfilled by Intro. or Adv. CC History courses.
